The half ended with the Cobras clinging to a 1-0 lead.

The Cobras came out strong in the second half and the first 5 minutes produced several shots on goal. But



the Twins keeper was up to the task and made some great saves to keep them in the match.

At about the 65 minute mark the Twins leveled the match on a cross from the right side that found a striker in the box who turned and scored.

The remainder of the match produced some furious runs by each side but neither was able to find the net and the

When did you start playing soccer? I grew up playing soccer for GCCSA since age 4 at Graham Elementary School in Shelby.

Where did you play (club) or rec, as a youngster? In addition to GCCSA I played for Crest Junior and Senior High and for GCCSA Select and Travel Teams. I also played while in the US Navy for club teams. While in graduate school at Campbell University I enjoyed playing in the intramural leagues each year.

How long have you coached a GCCSA team? 1 year but have coached 3 prior seasons in New Hanover county for 4-6 age range.

What do you like most about coaching? Teaching the youngsters basic soccer skills and seeing the smiles on their faces.



What do you like least about coaching? The time commitment can be tough.

What is your favorite GCCSA coaching memory? When I was a player, winning the overall league championship for a 6 year old team.

what advice would you give to a new coach? Have fun. There are great drills for children online. Get a soccer Mom/Dad to help with snacks, etc. It is about teaching when coaching younger children, not necessarily winning. If you teach basic skills, the children will win.

Anything else you would like to say? I enjoy the opportunity to both sponsor and coach my children and others. For a small, rural area, Cleveland County has a great youth soccer program. I would like to see an adult league form in the future. I imagine this is all a matter of time.
